• Guards must be maintained on all equipment with moving parts. 1926.600






• Workers are not wearing a hard hat. Hardhat PPE must be enforced. 1926.28, 1926.100




• **No SDS on site.** All employers with hazardous chemicals in their workplaces must have labels and safety data sheets for their exposed workers, and train them to handle the chemicals appropriately. Unable to locate. **1910.1200**



• Plastic gas cans are not acceptable to carry flammable liquids on a construction site. Metal safety cans with a working flash cap and spark suppressor must be used. 1926.152



• First Aid kits in place.



• OSHA 300A not posted. Remember to post OSHA 300A forms from February 1st thru April 30th.

Comments: Housekeeping in good shape. Safety meetings need to be held and documented
